



Content Creator and Photographer

The Content Creator and Photographer (CCP) is responsible to provide the Camp Kintail community with regular updates and insights into camp life. The CCP will contribute to the Camp Kintail blog and create photo and video content to be shared on Facebook, Instagram, TikTok, Twitter, and other emerging platforms. The CCP would work with interested staff to create a positive and community building presence on the internet.

Responsibilities:

- Ensure that the camp's philosophies are adhered to in all social media posts.
- Regularly update and share photos and posts on all of camp's social media platforms during the spring and summer. These include blog posts, photos, highlight videos, etc.
- Be available to take photographs and videos of activities and events around camp to be posted.
- Create several promotional videos throughout the summer.
- Ensure that children who do not have permission to have their photo taken are identified and proper precautions are taken.
- Be responsible for Camp Kintail's AV equipment, ensuring its safe storage and appropriate usage.
- Scan old camp photographs as requested and consider how to best share these with the Camp Kintail community.
- Prepare and lead sessions for staff training and orientation as requested.
- Provide input on Kintail's Internet and Social Media policies.
- Participate fully in the daily schedule and support all campers and staff to the best of your ability showing compassion, understanding, and role modeling behavior
- Facilitate camp sessions considering the age and abilities of campers when giving instructions (belaying at high ropes, archery, slide, slingshot, arts & crafts etc.)
- Provide the Director with a written final report. The final report should contain details about your role and suggestions for social media in the future.

Qualifications:

- Administrative skills.
- A demonstrated skill in web design, photography, videography, and social media is preferred.
- Experience working with children.
- A willingness to work in a team environment.
- A valid "G" level driver's license is desirable.
- Standard First Aid Certificate with CPR "C".
- A personal living faith.
- Previous camp experience is an asset.
