Challenge Course Coordinator

The Challenge Course Coordinator is responsible for facilitating safe climbs, as well as developing and leading creative games, team-building and goal setting activities at the high ropes course and rock wall. They must ensure that the High Challenge Course is always operating in accordance with TSSA and ACCT. They are in charge of setup and takedown, and to keep all equipment organized and in working order. They must be highly observant and aware of what is happening at all times to ensure all safety standards are being followed at all times at the course.

Responsibilities:

- Design appropriate high ropes, rock wall, and low ropes activities and lessons for camp sessions considering age and abilities of campers, as well as camp themes.
- Ensure that all staff working at the high ropes, rock wall and low ropes course are properly trained and prepared to effectively and safely facilitate.
- Prevent accidents/incidents on the high ropes, rock wall and low ropes through careful planning, observation, and safety awareness.
- Keep an inventory of all equipment as well as inspect the equipment daily to ensure its quality and safety.
- Ensure the safe storage of supplies and equipment throughout and at the end of the season.
- Ensure all participants are wearing appropriate attire including proper footwear when taking part on the high ropes, rock wall and low ropes course.
- Within reasonable limits, perform other duties as assigned by the Assistant Director and/or Camp Director including maintenance, kitchen, office, and special program projects.
- Assist with counselling campers as requested.
- Provide the Director with a written final report. The final report should contain details about the program area as well as suggestions for the future.

Qualifications:

- Experience climbing, especially in climbing instruction is a major asset.
- A willingness to work in a team environment.
- Strong facilitation skills.
- Standard First Aid with CPR "C".
- A willingness to be trained in high ropes/rock wall safety and facilitation, and the ability to pass the necessary training courses.
- A personal living faith.
- Previous camp experience is an asset.
- Experience working with children.
