

CHALLENGE COURSE COORDINATOR

BROAD RESPONSIBILITY:

The Challenge Course Coordinator is responsible for designing, implementing, and supervising team building and goal setting activities involving the high ropes, rock wall and low ropes courses which compliment Camp Kintail's philosophies, goals and programs. The Challenge Course Coordinator should aim to strengthen community and self-confidence, while meeting Ontario Camping Association standards.

RESPONSIBLE TO:

1. Design appropriate high ropes, rock wall, and low ropes activities for camp sessions considering age, gender and dynamics of campers, and camp themes.
2. Create lessons which cater to goal setting and group building for each age group of campers.
3. Order supplies needed for the summer with the Executive Director's approval and within budget limits.
4. Ensure that all staff facilitating the high ropes, rock wall and low ropes course are properly trained and prepared to facilitate.
5. Prevent accidents/incidents on the high ropes, rock wall and low ropes through careful planning and awareness, such as posting signs.
6. Keep a record of all equipment as well as inspect the equipment daily to ensure its quality and safety.
7. Ensure all participants are wearing appropriate attire including proper footwear when taking part on the high ropes, rock wall and low ropes course.
8. Work with the LIT RC's, VOK counsellors, Program Director, and the Outdoor Adventure Director to provide high and low ropes opportunities with these campers.
9. Ensure the safe storage of supplies and equipment throughout and at the end of the season.
10. To lead a week of Kintail On The Road as required.
11. Provide the Director with a written final report. The final report should contain details about the program area as well as suggestions for the future.
12. Participate fully as a program staff member and by word and deed encourage a faithful Christian witness.

POSSIBLE ADDITIONAL RESPONSIBILITIES:

The Challenge Course Coordinator is also often responsible to oversee outdoor adventure camps. They will be informed by the Camp Director if this is the case, and may refer to the appropriate job descriptions for specific responsibilities.

QUALIFICATIONS:

1. A minimum of two years camp leadership experience.
2. A minimum of one year camp counselling experience.
3. A personal living faith.
4. Experience and expertise in low ropes facilitation, climbing wall instruction, and high ropes facilitation.
5. A willingness to work in a team environment.
6. Skills involving group dynamics and communication.
7. Standard First Aid with CPR "C".
8. A willingness to be trained in high ropes facilitation and the ability to pass the training courses.
