

NATURE DIRECTOR

BROAD RESPONSIBILITIES:

The Nature Director is responsible for designing, implementing, and supervising a nature education program which compliments Camp Kintail's philosophies, goals and programs. The Nature Director should strive to heighten others environmental awareness, show how our actions affect the planet and present the Gospel of Jesus Christ as revealed in God's creation.

RESPONSIBLE TO:

1. Develop and teach a nature program which emphasizes the care of our site and world, and the wonder we discover in God's world around us.
2. Order supplies needed for the summer with the Executive Director's approval and within budget limits.
3. Develop, maintain and co-ordinate the use of nature trails.
4. Develop, maintain and co-ordinate the use of the nature program's materials and the areas of the site associated with the nature program.
5. Identify points and areas of specific ecological and environmental significance and make these known to staff and campers.
6. Serve as a resource to other staff members interested in providing programs for campers with an environmental or ecological focus.
7. Assist staff members in supervision of campers during nature sessions by providing them with clear instructions and expectations.
8. Work as a team with the Outdoor Living Skills Director, Site Manager, Maintenance Staff, and Executive Director to make Camp Kintail environmentally aware and friendly.
9. Work with the Program Director in the development of special nature theme days and programs.
10. Set up, maintain and care for the rabbit compound and rabbits, incorporating them into the nature program.
11. Ensure the safety, feeding and happy habitat of the rabbits.
12. Ensure the safe storage of supplies and equipment throughout and at the end of the season.
13. Lead a week of Kintail On The Road as requested.

14. Lead a week of Outdoor Adventure camp as requested.
15. Provide the Director with a written final report. The final report should contain details about the program area and make suggestions for the future.
16. Participate fully as a program staff member and by word and deed encourage a faithful Christian witness.

QUALIFICATIONS:

1. A minimum of two years experience as a camp staff member.
2. One year of camp counseling experience.
3. A personal living faith.
4. Knowledge and experience of the natural world, environmental concerns, and ecology.
5. A passion for sharing a love of God's creation with campers.
6. A willingness to work in a team environment.
7. A Standard First Aid Certificate with CPR "C".
