Frequently Asked Questions

What are Camp Kintail's plans for summer residential and day camps?

Camp Kintail has cancelled all residential and day camps for the summer of 2020.

Will I be able to receive a refund for the amount I have already paid?

The Camp Kintail Board is providing three options for families if summer camp is not able to happen. Families are invited to consider what makes the most sense for their financial situation.

Full Refund – We know that many families are struggling financially during this crisis. If you require a refund, this will be provided.

Credit – We are glad to give a credit to families for the amount that has already been paid to Kintail. This credit would extend over two years and could be used by any member of a family for any Kintail camp session or retreat or for Camp Kintail clothing. This is helpful to the camp as it allows us to have cashflow at the present time and reduces banking costs.

Donation – For those who are able, we hope you will consider donating some, or all, of the amount already paid to Kintail. The coming year will be a difficult one for Camp Kintail, and any donation you make would help to keep Camp strong for the years to come. Your donation will help with the costs that will happen this year with drastically reduced income, such as taxes, electricity, staffing, and maintenance. A tax receipt will be given for every donation made.

What is happening to the Kintail On the Road program?

Decisions have not been made for this program yet. This decision will be made in conjunction with our church partners. Congregations will let their registrants know of their decision when it has been made, and Camp Kintail will also let campers know through our website.

Will we be able to come to Kintail at all this summer?

We do not know the answer to this question yet. At the moment, Ontario remains in a state of emergency and gatherings are not allowed. When these restrictions are loosened, the Camp Board and Kintail staff will re-evaluate what might be possible. These options may include day use of the site, physically distanced family retreats, or even small day camps. Before any of these decisions are made, we will be carefully considering the health and safety risks for any participants. We would love to be able to open the site to guests this summer but keeping everyone safe is the top priority. We will let everyone know if we are able to offer any programs.

What is camp doing to make sure it is safe when it is able to be open?

When camp is able to be open, we will be following all the guidance of the Huron Perth Public Health, the Ontario government, and the Ontario Camping Association. We are already updating our policies and procedures relating to health and safety, infection control, cleaning guidelines, programming, and registration. Before camp opens in any capacity, we will have a thorough inspection by the public health inspector.

How can I support the camp?

We are so grateful for the many campers, parents, alumni, and churches who have reached out to let us know that they are praying for the camp. We would appreciate your continued prayers for the directors (Theresa & Johnathon), the year-round staff, the camp board, the summer staff, and all the campers who will not be able to come to camp this summer.

If your family is able to consider supporting the camp financially, it would make a big difference. Camp Kintail has currently cancelled six months of programming, school groups, summer camp sessions, retreats, and rentals. This has drastically impacted our financial situation. While the camp has been working diligently to be good stewards of the camp's finances, and had an operating reserve in place, we were not prepared for a pandemic.
