

Camp Kintail's Behaviour Expectations for Video Conferences

Guidelines for Families

Please encourage your child to follow these expectations while engaging in online programming:

- Treat the online space as they would when they are at Camp Kintail
- Engage and add to the conversations/discussions
- Dress for the video call as they would if they were to attend Camp Kintail (camp appropriate logos or graphics)
- Participate in the video session in a public space in the house such as a home office, family room or kitchen
- Show respect for Camp Kintail staff and other participants in the session
- Do not use the platform without parent supervision or consent. Parents are encouraged to use their discretion and be present in the room while their child is engaging in video conferencing.
- Refrain from friending or following Camp Kintail Leaders' personal accounts on social media, and ensure your child does not do that either. Please keep all communication with Camp Kintail Leaders via their professional email addresses.

How to use Zoom

Camp Kintail may use many different platforms to conduct programming, but most commonly video sessions will be conducted through Zoom Pro. Camp Kintail is committed to the safety of their campers, staff, and volunteers so they have chosen to use Zoom Pro which comes with additional security features like advanced meeting controls. Video conference invitations will be sent as a link in an email. For campers under the age of 13 invitations will be sent to parents/guardians, while invitations to sessions for campers 13 or older will be sent to their personal email address with their parent's consent. When you click on the Zoom Pro meeting link, you will be prompted to download Zoom. Make sure your computer is set up for audio and video. Please complete this process at least 30 minutes before your first Video Conference begins to ensure you are able to access the call.

Best Practices

- Make sure that your camera is uncovered if you'd like to be visible.
- Ensure that you are in a good space for a call; quiet and set up in a way that makes you feel comfortable, as your surroundings will be visible to others if you turn on video.
- Camp Kintail requests that participants are in a public space in the house such as a home office, family room or kitchen, and that they are dressed appropriately for the session
